Guidelines of a Marist project in MDA Pastoral

We give to the Project a clearly perceptible Christian identity *

We give to the Project a clearly perceptible Marist identity (simplicity, family spirit, love of work, love of Mary)

We establish an interreligious and intercultural dialogue

The Project is located in a place not too much away from other Marist projects so that the communication between them is not difficult

Brothers will not go where other education specialized Congregations already are

Guidelines of a Marist project in MDA

Education

We get the explicit agreement of the local authorities (religious and civil) and sign a contract with them

We go to places where others cannot go or don't want to go.

We work with children and youths materially poor

We work with marginalized people (minorities, tribal, etc)

We bring our Marist pedagogy and style of education

Brothers will not open a Project without consulting with local people

Guidelines of a Marist project in MDA

Community

Brothers adopt a simple life style, as close as possible to the standards of the people around

Brothers ensure a revenue for their work (even if it is small) and try to sustain their community expenses with it

We show our internationality by the composition of our communities (at least 3 Brothers, coming from different countries)

Vocations

We go to areas where there is a realistic hope for having Marist vocations

We work on raising Marist vocations knowing that after us there will not be other missionaries coming to the mission country

Guidelines of a Marist project in MDA

Finances

Brothers can sustain the Project in the short/mid term with the help of some Organization(s)

The Project will be self-sustainable in the long term


